SEL CORNER (SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING)

Dear EDUPRIZE families,

Welcome back to Q2!

Coming back from a break is an excellent time for teachers and parents alike to help kids PRACTICE desired behaviors. Lecturing alone will not result in a change in a child's behavior - it is the muscle memory of the practice of the desired behavior that makes it a habit.

Here are some tips from Andrews University on what you can do:

1. Connect with child's emotions. Do not argue about the accuracy of their perceptions; instead, say things like, "Yeah, I can understand that you felt really frustrated."



- 2. Think of behaviors that the child could do that would make things go better next time. Give the child the first chance to come up with ideas, but, it's OK for you to give the child specific things to do if the child has a hard time thinking of appropriate things to do on their own. The important thing is to have several ideas about what they could do to make things go better, then have THEM choose what to try.
- 3. Role play 5-7 times the appropriate ways while praising the positive behaviors. For younger children or children with attention deficits, 3 times may be all they can do. For older children and repeat offenses, more repetitions are appropriate. Be sure to praise the child for how well they do the appropriate behavior during the role play. In the role plays, be sure that you initially role play a positive outcome for the appropriate behavior. As you proceed closer to the 5th or 7th role play, you may choose to make the outcome more difficult to achieve to help expand and strengthen the child's skills. During Positive Practice, you want the child's appropriate behaviors to bring the child success. Success is a great motivator!

Health Office Updates



IMPORTANT HEALTH OFFICE INFORMATION

As illness or health situations occur throughout the school year, it may be necessary for medication to be administered at school. All prescribed AND over the counter medication (i.e. Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Benadryl, etc.) will need to be checked into the Health Office, along with a Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent form which requires a doctor's signature. These forms can be found on our website www.eduprizeschools.net under the Parent & Student Resources>Health Office Forms, or you can just click on any of the links provided in light blue.

- HEALTH ACTION PLAN: Please be aware that children who have asthma, diabetes, or seizures
 will need an action plan provided by their health care provider, ALONG with the signed
 Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent form.
- <u>ASTHMA</u>: If your child has asthma, an asthma action plan will need to be provided by your doctor ALONG with a signed <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form.
- ALLERGIES: Allergies that require an EpiPen will need an <u>Anaphylaxis Management Packet</u> filled out and signed by a doctor along with the <u>Prescription and Non-prescription</u>
 <u>Medication Consent</u> form.
- MEDICATION: As a reminder, ALL medications need to be checked in at the Health Office.
 Students should not carry medications in their backpacks. A <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form will also need to be filled out for any medications, prescription or non prescription.

We cannot accept ANY medications without these forms.



<u>Destruction of Records: Public Notice - Retention of Special Education Records</u>

In accordance with ARS §41-1351, the retention period is four (4) years for special education records. EDUPRIZE Schools LLC will destroy special education records of dismissed students or students withdrawn from any EDUPRIZE location for four (4) years or more from the current academic year.

Prior to the destruction of records, you have the right to review the records and obtain copies of any information. To obtain records you must be the parent or the legal guardian of the student or the student (age 18 or older). Please indicate your request by contacting the Special Education Department of the campus the student attended before December 31.

If you do not contact the Special Education Department on or before December 1, we will destroy all records four (4) years older than the current academic year. We store current records electronically. Contact the Special Education Department in Gilbert at 480-813-9537 ext 2810 or in Queen Creek at 480-888-1610 ext 1414 to get a copy.
