SEL CORNER (SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING)

Dear EDUPRIZE families,

Every month, our teachers meet to discuss behavior patterns they are seeing and they set goals with supporting strategies to help kids improve on specific behaviors. This past Friday, most teachers saw the pattern of self-control being an important focus as we head into a fun and busy holiday season!



Here are some tips from EDUTOPIA to help your child develop self-control (often referred to as self-regulation):

- Talk clearly, simply, and often about behaviors that matter. Such as, "Reading time is quiet time."
- Establish routines. Young children may not be able to tell time, but they do become accustomed to the cadence of a regular schedule.
- Build in time for happy movement throughout the day. Alternate sedentary activities with play-based activities can help kids regulate their behavior.
- Call attention to attention. The ability to focus attention on learning tasks is a crucial executive function for future school success.
- Make a game out of it. Computer games and concentration-style card games can help young children develop their working memory.
- Encourage prosocial behaviors. Another form of gaining self-control is learning to take others' feelings and welfare into account.



Giving Tree - We will be collecting presents to assist families in need. We will need help organizing and distributing these items during the week of December 11th-15th.



Health Office Updates



IMPORTANT HEALTH OFFICE INFORMATION

As illness or health situations occur throughout the school year, it may be necessary for medication to be administered at school. All prescribed AND over the counter medication (i.e. Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Benadryl, etc.) will need to be checked into the Health Office, along with a Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent form which requires a doctor's signature. These forms can be found on our website www.eduprizeschools.net under the Parent & Student Resources>Health Office Forms, or you can just click on any of the links provided in light blue.

- HEALTH ACTION PLAN: Please be aware that children who have asthma, diabetes, or seizures
 will need an action plan provided by their health care provider, ALONG with the signed
 Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent form.
- <u>ASTHMA</u>: If your child has asthma, an asthma action plan will need to be provided by your doctor ALONG with a signed <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form.
- <u>ALLERGIES</u>: Allergies that require an EpiPen will need an <u>Anaphylaxis Management Packet</u> filled out and signed by a doctor along with the <u>Prescription and Non-prescription</u>
 <u>Medication Consent form</u>.
- MEDICATION: As a reminder, ALL medications need to be checked in at the Health Office.
 Students should not carry medications in their backpacks. A <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form will also need to be filled out for any medications, prescription or non prescription.

We cannot accept ANY medications without these forms.


