

# Principal's Message

#### Dear EDUPRIZE Parents,

As always, I love being the principal of EDUPRIZE! I love the students, the families, and my incredible teachers and staff, who give their ALL every day! Teaching is a profession of the heart, and I'm in awe of all that my staff does here because they truly care. One thing we talk about daily is called growth mindset. Growth mindset describes people who believe that their success depends on time and effort. People with a growth mindset feel their skills and intelligence can be improved with effort and persistence. They embrace challenges, persist through obstacles, learn from criticism, and seek out inspiration from others' success. Those who hold a growth mindset believe that they can get better at something through dedication of time, effort, and energy. Working on one's flaws, and the process—not the outcome—are the most important components. With time and practice, people with a growth mindset believe they can achieve what they want. The opposite of a growth mindset is a fixed mindset.

Research shows that parents can have a powerful impact on their child's mindsets. The language you use and the actions you take show your children what you expect. Giving praise to process, accepting mistakes as learning opportunities, and understanding the role of emotions in learning all lead to a growth mindset, as opposed to a fixed one. Here are a few suggestions on how to foster that growth mindset by choosing words carefully when praising your children.

Fixed Mindset	Growth Mindset	
"You are so smart!"	I can see you worked so hard on this!"	
"It's okay. Maybe you're just not cut out for this."	"It seems like it's time to try a new strategy."	
"You're a natural at this!"	"I like watching you do that."	
"That's right! You did that so quickly and easily; great job!"	"It looks like that was pretty easy for you. Let's find you something challenging so your brain can grow."	
"That's not right. Are you paying attention in class? It seems like you're not even trying."	"That's not right. You don't understand this yet. What strategies can you try to understand it better?"	
"That was really hard. I'm so glad it's over and you don't have to do that again."	"That was really hard. Your effort has paid off! Next time you'll be ready for this kind of challenge."	
"You have a real talent for writing. You should take a creative writing class because you're so good at it."	"You've worked hard to become a good writer. You should challenge yourself with an advanced class, and learn something you don't know how to do yet."

# SEL CORNER (SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING)

Dear EDUPRIZE families,

A new year is a time when we reflect on the past and set goals for the future. According to Edward Locke and Gary Latham's research, some principles help ensure your success in meeting goals. These can apply to your own personal goals and/or the goals you set with your child(ren).



- Clarity Setting goals that are clear and specific eliminates the confusion Heather Vehon that occurs when a goal is set in a more generic manner (like, "I want Dean of Students K-6th to read more"). Your child's goal might be, "I want to read 20 minutes per night."
- Challenging goals stretch your mind and cause you to think bigger. This helps you accomplish more. Each success you achieve helps you build a winning mindset.
- Commitment If you don't commit to your goal with everything you have it is less likely you will achieve it.
- Feedback helps you know what you are doing right and how you are doing. This allows you to adjust your expectations and your plan of action going forward. You might explain to your child how YOU stay on track with YOUR goals.
- Task Complexity It's important to set goals that are aligned with the goal's complexity. Chat with your child to ensure their goal is not too easy and not too hard.





# Health Office Updates



#### **IMPORTANT HEALTH OFFICE INFORMATION**

As illness or health situations occur throughout the school year, it may be necessary for medication to be administered at school. All prescribed AND over the counter medication (i.e. Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Benadryl, etc.) will need to be checked into the Health Office, along with a <a href="Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent">Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</a> form which requires a doctor's signature. These forms can be found on our website <a href="https://www.eduprizeschools.net">www.eduprizeschools.net</a> under the Parent & Student Resources>Health Office Forms, or you can just click on any of the links provided in light blue.

- HEALTH ACTION PLAN: Please be aware that children who have asthma, diabetes, or seizures
  will need an action plan provided by their health care provider, ALONG with the signed
  Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent form.
- <u>ASTHMA</u>: If your child has asthma, an asthma action plan will need to be provided by your doctor ALONG with a signed <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form.
- <u>ALLERGIES</u>: Allergies that require an EpiPen will need an <u>Anaphylaxis Management Packet</u> filled out and signed by a doctor along with the <u>Prescription and Non-prescription</u>
   <u>Medication Consent form</u>.
- MEDICATION: As a reminder, ALL medications need to be checked in at the Health Office.
   Students should not carry medications in their backpacks. A <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form will also need to be filled out for any medications, prescription or non prescription.

We cannot accept ANY medications without these forms.

## Homeless Education

#### Rights of Homeless Students

**EDUPRIZE Schools, LLC** shall provide an educational environment that treats all students with dignity and respect. Every homeless student shall have access to the same free and appropriate educational opportunities as students who are not homeless. This commitment to the educational rights of homeless children, youth, and unaccompanied youth, applies to all services, programs, and activities provided or made available.

#### McKinney-Vento Definition of Homeless:

The term "homeless children and youth"— means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence [42 U.S.C. § 11434a(2)].

A student may be considered eligible for services as a "Homeless Child or Youth" under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act if he or she is presently living in one of the following situations:

- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason,
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations,
- living in emergency or transitional shelters; or are abandoned in hospitals,
- have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings,
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings, or
- is a migratory child who qualifies as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described above.



#### Rights of Homeless Students

To remove educational barriers for children and youths experiencing homelessness, the McKinney-Vento Act mandates the following: **Immediate Enrollment**: Documentation and immunization records cannot serve as a barrier to the enrollment in school [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(C)].

School Selection and Maintained Enrollment: McKinney Vento eligible students have a right to select from the options outlined below. Students may remain enrolled in their selected schools for the duration of homelessness, and until the end of the academic year upon which they are permanently housed or enroll the child or youth in any public school that non-homeless students who live in the attendance area in which the child or youth is living are eligible to attend. [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(A), 42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(B) and 42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(I) (i)].

School of Origin	School of Residency

**Transportation Services:** McKinney-Vento eligible students attending their School of Origin have a right to transportation to and from the School of Origin [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(1)(J)(iii)].

Participation in Programs: McKinney-Vento eligible students are guaranteed the right to services comparable to services offered to other students in the school [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(4) & (6)(iii)].

**Unaccompanied Youth Experiencing Homelessness:** McKinney-Vento eligible students are guaranteed the right to immediate enrollment without proof of guardianship [42 U.S.C. §1432(g)(1)(H)(iv)].

Access to Extracurricular Activities: Removal of barriers to accessing academic and extracurricular activities for homeless students who meet relevant eligibility criteria [42 U.S.C. §11432(q)(1)(F)(iii)].

**Dispute Resolution**: If you disagree with school officials about enrollment, transportation, or fair treatment of a homeless child or youth, you may file a complaint with the school district [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(E)].

**Appointment of a Local Homeless Liaison:** The McKinney-Vento Act mandates the appointment of a local Homeless Liaison in every school district or local education agency (LEA) to ensure that homeless children and youth are enrolled in and have a full and equal opportunity to succeed in school [42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(1)(J)(ii) and U.S.C. §11432(g)(6)(A)].
